

Eligible Educational Materials

- Textbooks (book, workbook, manual, or book substitute for individual use)
- Individual instructional materials (used as a complementary source of study)
- Standardized tests (tests and scoring services)

Examples of eligible materials

Educational materials meeting the general conditions of eligibility and falling into any of the following groups of material are considered eligible.

Published materials; periodicals; documents; pamphlets; photographs; reproductions; pictorial or graphic works; filmstrips; prepared slides; prerecorded video programs; prerecorded tapes, cassettes and sound recordings; manipulative materials; desk charts; games; study prints and pictures; desk maps; models; learning kits; blocks or cubes; flashcards; individualized multimedia systems; prepared instructional computer software programs; and prerecorded film cartridges.

Examples of materials NOT eligible

- Religious
- Spiritual
- Sacred

Classroom supplies consumed in the normal instructional process, educational materials intended for general classroom use rather than individual use, instructional equipment, and teacher's aides.

Instructional supplies such as blank tapes, blank cassettes, blank videotapes, blank computer diskettes, unexposed film, writing paper, construction paper, notebooks, thumbtacks, chalk, erasers, ink, paste, scissors, pencils, pens, crayons, chemicals, duplicating fluids, blackboards, wall maps, wall charts, processed movie film, instructional equipment, library books, or other reference materials.
