

CLASSIFICATION 1: Regularly Exposed Employees

JOB CATEGORIES WHERE THE PRIMARY ACTIVITY IS ADMINISTERING FIRST AID OR HEALTHCARE

Below are listed the job categories (based on the results of the assessment) where employee’s job description is administering first aid or healthcare and as a result have occupational exposure to bloodborne pathogens. The procedures these employees must follow are delineated in the “Work Activities/Tasks” section of the Exposure Control Plan.

CLASSIFICATION 2: Occasionally Exposed Employees

JOB CATEGORIES WHERE SOME EMPLOYEES PROVIDE FIRST AID, HEALTHCARE OR CLEAN UP BLOOD OR OPIM AS AN AUXILIARY COMPONENT OF THEIR DUTIES AND ARE THEREFORE POTENTIALLY EXPOSED TO BLOODBORNE PATHOGENS

Below are listed the job categories and the specific employees (based on the results of the assessment) where employees provide first aid, healthcare or clean up blood or OPIM as an auxiliary component of their duties. The procedures these employees must follow are delineated in the “Work Activities/Tasks” section of the Exposure Control Plan.
